Malala Yousafzai

Malala Yousafzai is a Pakistani activist who as a teenager, spoke out publicly against the prohibition of the education of girls. Malala survived an assassination attempt when she fought for the right to education for girls in Pakistan. Attack on her was a violation of human rights to education and gender equality. This has highlighted the issues regarding 61 million out-of-school children, mainly comprised of girls. The cause for this issue has been mainly due to practices such as early marriage, gender-based violence, or laws and social/cultural norms that prevent girls from getting enrolled or completing schools. Malala asked the global community to pay more attention to the right to education of girls and women and take actions on this issue, which has impacted much to the whole community.
