Why do we mark this day?



Tourism is one of the growing economic sectors worldwide. It employs one out of every ten people and provides a living for hundreds of millions more. For some countries, it represents over 20 percent of their GDP (Gross Domestic Product). People have benefitted from the constant growth of the tourism sector over the past years. The progression of tourism has also helped in eradicating poverty by providing employment opportunities.

Thus, seeing many important contributions made by tourism encouraged the UN World Tourism Organization (UNWTO) to institute World Tourism Day in a meeting that took place in Spain, commencing the first celebration in 1980. This date was chosen to coincide with an important milestone in world tourism: the 10th anniversary of the adoption of the UNWTO Statutes on 27 September 1970.
